

THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAMME IN HUNGARY







By locating the management unit on the CWP level, the SDG Water-PF increases the likelihood of local ownership and the sustainability of results whilst benefitting from the overall GWP network structure.

The management of the programme is done through

In Hungary, the Country Water Partnership (GWP Hungary) is the project manager. Partners are governmental institutions mandated to implement the SDGs as well as non-governmental partners.

Already involved are the Ministry of Interior, the General Directorate of Water Management, the Hungarian Energy and Public Utility Regulatory Authority, several regional water directorates, the Hungarian Hydrological Society, the Chamber of Engineers, the Hungarian Water Utility Association. Further stakeholders will be mobilised into the process during the design phase.









THE PROGRAMME IS ORGANIZED AROUND THE FOLLOWING SIX WORK PACKAGES (WPs):

- WP1 Linking SDG 6 targets to national policies and plans and prioritising actions for implementation
- WP2 Developing and preparing actions to access finance
- WP3 Monitoring SDG 6
- WP4 Sharing knowledge for SDG 6 implementation
- WP5 Developing capacities for SDG 6 implementation
- WP6StrengtheningpartnershipsforSDG6implementation
